

TOOL LIST FOR TECHNIQUES CLASS

- ✧ Smoothing or jack plane (14" and less, metal or wood).
 - ✧ Low angle **block plane**, preferably 1 $\frac{3}{8}$ ". It's worth spending money on these; avoid the new Stanley #60-1/2 and Record of any vintage. Older Stanley and new Sweethearts are adequate.
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| ✧ Dovetail saw (Western or Japanese) | ✧ Hand scraper |
| ✧ Set of chisels $\frac{1}{8}$ " to 1" | ✧ Burnishing tool |
| ✧ Marking gauge (Veritas or equal; better suited to modest work than blocky types) | ✧ Rule or tape measure |
| ✧ 6" engineers square | ✧ Small bevel gauge |
| ✧ Straight blade screwdrivers: $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6",
$\frac{5}{16}$ " stubby for tightening cap iron screws
(Craftsman #00941586000 optional) | ✧ Small mallet (approximately 10 oz. for chopping dovetails) |
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- ✧ Sharpening stones, either:
Oil stones: India, soft Arkansas or Washita, and hard Arkansas; or
Water stones: 800 & 1200 grit and 6000 (King "S") or equivalent
 - ✧ Files: 4" mill smooth, 6-8" mill bastard° and an inexpensive set of needle files
 - ✧ Safety glasses or goggles
 - ✧ Glue bottle
 - ✧ Hearing protectors (w/o stereo)
 - ✧ Bench brush

| ✧ 12" Starrett combination square | ✧ Cabinet scraper |
| ✧ Spoke shave (Stanley 151 or Kuntz adjustable throat) | ✧ Small manual drill |
| ✧ Clamps (small cam, quick action, or hand) | ✧ Dust mask |
| ✧ Small auxiliary bench vise | ✧ Carving knives |
| ✧ Straight edge (18 or 24") | ✧ Anti-fatigue mat |
| ✧ Coffee mug of sufficient quality to resist high-test corrosion | ✧ Carving tools (optional) |
